Together, we will continue to make a profound difference in the lives of individuals living with disabilities.





### Life Changing Impact

Before discovering Project MEND, Rosemary faced daily challenges that kept her from the life she loved. While she could move around her home, long distances were impossible due to severe back pain that often affected her breathing. Simple joys like grocery shopping, visiting the botanical gardens with her husband, or enjoying weekly lunches with friends were out of reach. The hardest part for Rosemary was missing her grandson's college baseball games. "Not being able to see my grandson play killed me the most," she shared with emotion, feeling the weight of lost moments with her family. Everything changed when Rosemary connected with **Project MEND**. "They treated me like I was the most important person in the world,"

she said, describing the care and support she received. With a motorized scooter provided by Project MEND, Rosemary has regained her independence and reconnected with the people and activities she treasures. She can now visit the botanical gardens, enjoy lunches with friends, and, most importantly, cheer her grandson on from the stands. For Rosemary, the scooter has not only restored her mobility but also brought joy and meaning back into her life, allowing her to once again fully embrace the moments that matter most.
